Shooting Information

Outdoor Season

The outdoor season runs from April to October at the Asterdale sports ground.

Sunday sessions include Club Target shoots and Tournament days. Sighters are around 12:45.

Practice is held on Wednesday and Friday evenings at the Asterdale sports ground, core times are 17:30 to 19:30.

Please make sure you arrive at least half an hour before sighters to help set up the field.

Indoor Season

The outdoor season runs from November to March at West Park School, West Road, Spondon.

Sunday sessions include a variety of shoots. Sighters are around 12:45.

Also during this season once a month a Frostbite is held at the Asterdale sports ground.

Thursday practice evenings are also at West Park School.

Please make sure you arrive at least half an hour before sighters to help set up the hall.

When shooting indoors please wear trainers with non-marking soles.

All members **must** pay the appropriate green fees and sign the green fees book every time they shoot. Members will not be covered by the Clubs insurance if they have not signed the book.

All members will also need to be available to help tidy up equipment at the end of the shoot.

Archers are encouraged to wear Club shirts or Green and White clothing when shooting.

Scoring

The scoring points for hits on the target face are as follows:

Colour	Archery GB Rounds	Metric Rounds

Yellow	9	10	9
Red	7	8	7
Blue	5	6	5
Black	3	4	3
White	1	2	1

The value shall be determined by the position of the arrow shaft.

If the arrow touches two colours or any dividing line it shall be scored as being that of the higher value.

An arrow hitting and remaining embedded in another arrow shall be scored the same as the arrow struck.

In the event of a tie for a score prize the winner shall be the one with the greatest number of hits.

If there is still a tie the archer with the greatest number of gold's will be the winner.

If this still results in a tie, joint winners will be declared.

Where there is a prize for the most hits, a tie will be resolved by the highest score and then most gold's.

A prize for the most gold's will be resolved by the highest score and then most hits.

An arrow outside of the scoring area or a miss shall be recorded on the score sheet as an M.

Handicap System

Member's handicaps are displayed in the Container.

To obtain a handicap Archers must record a score for at least 3 recognised rounds shot at either a club target tournament or Open tournament.
